



### **General Rules of Match Play (Rule 2)**

In Match Play, the game is played by holes. The lower net score wins the hole. A hole is halved if each side holes out in the same number of net strokes. A match is won when one side leads by a number of holes greater than the number remaining to be played. If the match is tied after nine holes, the match is halved. The state of the match is expressed by the terms: so many “holes up” or “all square”, and so many “to play”.

A player may concede a stroke, a hole or a match. A concession may not be declined or withdrawn.

**Men under 70 play the White Tees and Men 70 and over may play the Gold Tees.**

**Women under 70 play the Red Tees and Women 70 and over may play the Teal Tees.**

**If playing from different tees within a match, make the appropriate hdcp adjustment.**

**The ball will be played down, with the exception of the Alternate shot format.**

**The Rules Committee consists of the 2 Captains and the golf professional. Their decisions are final.**

### **Four Ball Match Play (Rule 30-3)**

- Two play their better ball net score against the better ball net score of two other players.

**Handicap Allowance:** The Course Handicap of the players is reduced by the course handicap of the player with the lowest handicap, who then plays from scratch. The other three players will apply the difference to the 9 holes they are playing where they fall on the scorecard.

### **Foursomes with Selected Drives (Rule 29-Modified Alternate Shot)**

- Two play against two using one ball. Both partners will tee off. The best shot of the two will be selected and players will alternate shots until the ball is holed. The player whose drive was not selected must play the next shot. The ball may be placed within 6” of the original ball, not nearer the hole. In a bunker or water hazard the ball must be placed on the same spot if it is to be played. The player’s own ball may be substituted for the selected shot. Penalty strokes do not affect the order of play. If a player plays when his/her partner should have played, his/her side loses the hole.

**Handicap Allowance:** 60 percent of the A player’s course handicap and 40 percent of the B player’s course handicap will be added together and rounded to create the team handicap. The lower handicapped side will play from scratch and the higher handicapped side will apply the difference to the 9 holes they are playing where they fall on the scorecard.

### **Singles Match Play (Rule 2)**

- In Singles Match Play, a match is won by the player who is leading by a number of holes greater than the number of holes remaining to be played.

**Handicap Allowance:** The higher handicapped player receives the full difference in course handicap between the two players and applies it to where they fall on the scorecard on the 9 holes being played. The lower handicapped player plays from scratch.
